DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE: Question, Persuade, Refer is an evidence-based suicide prevention protocol, also termed as a gatekeeper training, with a mission to save lives and reduce suicidal behaviors by providing innovative, practical and proven suicide prevention training. QPR stands for Question, Persuade, and Refer — the 3 simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide.

According to the Surgeon General's National Strategy for Suicide Prevention (2001), a gatekeeper is someone in a position to recognize a crisis and the warning signs that someone may be contemplating suicide. People trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help.

Gatekeepers can be anyone, but include all those who are strategically positioned to recognize and refer someone at risk of suicide, like school personnel and community leaders.

QPR-trained Gatekeepers learn to:

- Recognize the warning signs of suicide
- Know how to offer hope
- Know how to get help and save a life
